Registration deadline is Friday, March 15th, yet classes can fill prior to deadline. Classes are kept at manageable size with minimum and maximum enrollment to ensure the best experience for all participants. Enrollment is based on date/time stamp of registration receipt.

Plan to begin classes unless you are notified your enrollment request cannot be accommodated.

If your child is enrolled in BASRP, please notify them when you enroll your child in ASE courses. Please pick up your child promptly after classes. Children not picked up promptly at the end of class will be taken to BASRP (daycare) and you will be charged.

Complimentary bus transportation is offered to take students Mon/Tues/Wed to attend ASE classes. Please complete the Bus Pass application and submit it with registration. Transportation makes every effort to arrive on time, however unexpected bus demands can occur that will affect getting your child to class in a timely manner.

Ballet Beginners (grades 1 & 2) FLORENCE WONG DAVI 3:20-4:20 RHD Ottertorium \$60

Beginners will start with learning the basic steps of ballet. The class will be divided into floor work, barre, center, adagio, allegro and reverence. Students will perform simple combinations at slow and andante tempo, and will also learn: plié, tendu, elevé, supple, retire, sauté, gallops, skips, reverence, port de bras, first, second and third feet position. We will learn different tempos in ballet music, along with well recognized music such as the Nutcracker and Swan Lake. Outfit: Dance leotard or blouse, tights and socks.
